Avery Morris, Violinist, and Lara Smaldanha, Pianist, both students working on DMAs at Stony Brook University, will give a concert of Schumann, Sonata no. 1 in A minor for Violin and Piano, op. 105, and Prokofiev, Sonata no. 1 in F minor for Violin and Piano, op. 80 on Friday, September 23rd at 7 pm. I have, for reference, included this anecdote to highlight the supreme difficulty of the Schumann Sonata: it was the Schumann Violin Sonata and the Ravel Trio that officially broke up my first trio that I used to perform with. Of course, differences in goals and personal values had a say in it, but the supreme difficulty of the Schumann managed to bring all of those other troublesome minutiae to the fore, just PREPARING to record it.
