#### The Alfred Hollins Lecture Recital

On February 23rd a true scholar, Ruaraidh Sutherland, Sub dean of the Nassau Chapter of the AGO, presented a splendid lecture recital on the life and works of Alfred Hollins, at St. John's Episcopal Church in Cold Spring Harbor.

(1865-1942) blind was organist/pianist/composer of boundless talent adaptability given his considerable and handicap. Our presenter took us through his life, starting with his early years in the city of Hull, to his fame as a recitalist, both on piano and organ, a rare thing then, and even more rare at the present time, right to the end of his life, mostly in Edinburgh, by which time he'd become internationally famous.

He played some wonderful examples of his works on the organ: Concert Overture in C, Adagio Cantabile in D, Berceuse, in E, A Trumpet Minuet, and his last work: Andante and Finale. Mr. Sutherland, on piano, was most ably assisted by Bryce Westervelt, Director of Music at St. John's, singing two of Hollins's most popular songs: The Silver Cord, and My Mary. The combination of Ruaraidh's fine accompanying, and Bryce's wonderfully sensitive singing brought very emotional reactions from us in the audience! Deeply moving music making indeed!

### **Festival of Hymns**

The Church of St. Patrick in Huntington was the site of a truly monumental FESTIVAL OF HYMNS on Sunday, March 2. This event was cosponsored by the Nassau and Suffolk Chapters of the AGO.

A massed choir from TWENTY Churches/Choral groups, numbering ONE-HUNDRED singers gathered there, after the previous day's nearly six-hour rehearsal, energized both vocally and spiritually, before a large and most appreciative congregation. Of the 14 hymns that were performed, many required enthusiastic participation on the part of the assembly, and those of us in attendance heard truly glorious music-making!

We were so ably led by the Festival Co-Directors: Michael C. Haigler, Matthew Koraus, and Bryce Westervelt. Their careful, instructive teaching resulted in absolutely triumphant sounds from a group of singers for whom we have boundless gratitude and appreciation! These wonderful singers were supremely complemented by Henry

DeVries's sensitive and wonderful organ accompaniment, ably assisted by a fine brass quartet and tympanist, producing thrilling sounds when all combined.

One of the highlights was a performance of *Deep River* arr. by Hogan, with rich divisi parts and some high notes that every soprano there can still take pride in!

The co-directors showed their talents as arrangers/composers in many of the hymns we sang. Very careful and skillful directions were given for each verse of each of the hymns involving the congregation, and all followed these very well indeed. Their skills as conductors were wonderfully obvious seeing the attention the singers paid to them, and the results they achieved.

Some further highlights: Love Divine, All Loves Excelling, arr. Haigler; The Church's One Foundation, arr. Ferguson; Come Ye Thankful People, Come, arr. Koraus; Abide With Me, arr. Koras; The Day of Resurrection arr. Haigler; America the Beautiful, arr. Koraus. These were all with organ, brass and tympani, and these arrangements are truly inspired by gentlemen of deep and abiding faith, and one can hear it in every single measure!

Henry DeVries favored us with some organ solos as we gave our voices a bit of rest: Karg-Elert March Triomphale on NUN DANKET ALLE GOTT, with brass, arr. Koraus, and later: Liebster Jesu, wir sind hier, by Bach, and When in Our Music God Is Glorified, by Robert Hobby. Wonderful playing, perfect registration on the fine Gluck organ.

Many more wonderful things can be said about this event, but many think the best is: WE WANT ANOTHER ONE NEXT YEAR, said by so many at its conclusion.

What did Oliver Latry say about sound in the newly renovated Notre Dame de Paris Cathedral?

Our longtime chapter member and chapter archivist/historian, Judy Feuss, is retiring. For how many years has she been sitting on the organ bench playing at church services?

72 years! Congratulations, Judy!

I teel Joy mixed with apprehension" he told Radio France Musique. The organ, undamaged in the fire, has been cleaned of lead dust pollution. But Latry worries about the acoustics. "They are not as they were before, and we organists will have to adapt to that. While the reverberation time is the same, the sound seems to resonate differently. We can't really tell so far, as thew cathedral isn't yet in its finished state." (Quoted in literature sent by the Friends of Motre Dame de Paris).
