Every submission needs to clearly state the time and place of the event being announced. A reminder that in this busy age items with too much text tend to go unread - less is more! A contact phone number or email must accompany all notices.

Our Sanctuary is conveniently located within walking distance of the Merrick, Long Island Railroad Station – a 50minute train ride from Penn Station, or easily accessible by car.

We have a fine 2 manual, 18 rank Schlicker Pipe Organ, along with a piano and keyboard. Our primary worship resource is the Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal.

Qualifications:

- Experience playing hymns and various liturgical settings.

Responsibilities:
